Players have a positive, life-long experience of the game and members can remain within the Irish Rugby family throughout their lives, fulfilling a role that enables them to be the best version of themselves.

Fun

A passion for the game, on and off the pitch, rugby is a source of joy for many people, especially youth. We endeavour to make it an enjoyable space where members are accepted for who they are irrespective of gender, sexuality, race or religion. All players have an equal right to learn and play the game and should be respected for the age and stage of development that they are; especially youth players.

Excellence

Strive to be the best that I can be, know that there may be others who play better than me, make better decisions and perform under pressure better. But I will finish my task knowing that I could not have done more for myself, the opponents and clubmates and I can stand by the fact that I did my best.
